(I) Brief Details of the Competition

Introduction

The Junior Police Call (JPC) has been committed to the provision of a wide range of activities and training for young people over the years. In 2021, a new strategy – IDEAS@JPC was introduced, where 'I' stands for Innovation, 'D' for Discipline, 'E' for Exposure, 'A' for Adventure and 'S' for Synergy. JPC has also introduced the annual JPC Award Scheme to encourage young people to participate in various activities for nurturing more young leaders to fight crime together.

To suit the needs of students, cope with the development trend of STEAM education and promote the development of innovative thinking activities under the new strategy of JPC, JPC has launched the 'JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2023-24' (the 'Competition'), which is divided into three phases: learning; competition; and award presentation and exhibition. Through an approach based on the concept of 'Smart City', primary and secondary school students will give full play to their STEAM-related knowledge and skills by consolidating them in collaborative projects on enhancing the effectiveness of city management and safety and improving people's quality of living.

Objective

The goal of the Competition is to provide an appropriate platform for student engagement in experiential learning on topics of mobility, living, environment and economy to put the concept of 'Smart City' into practice by proposing innovative and feasible solutions. The Creative Design Drawings of the Junior Primary Category are based on the topic of 'Cyber Security' or 'Information Literacy', using creative thinking and drawing to present the topics on a drawing paper. In particular, students can develop skills in problem solving and logical reasoning, as well as inspiring their creative thinking with the objective of building a city incorporating intelligence and safety so that people can live in one of the safest and most stable societies in the world.

Enrolment Details

Students can enrol in the Competition by the two following means:

- 1. Visit the JPC website (https://www.hkpjpc.org.hk)
- - Posted (to G.P.O Box No. 28247, date of postmark no later than the deadline);
 - Dropped off in person during office hours in the collection box (at the reception on 1/F, Arsenal House, Police Headquarters, 1 Arsenal Street, Wan Chai, Hong Kong);
 - Dropped off in person at police stations in various districts (addressed to Police Community Relations Office); or
 - Group Enrolment and Submission (collected by and submitted via schools or organizations):
 - Participants can directly pass the completed enrolment forms to the representatives of the schools or organizations (if any), and no further online enrolment is required. Then the representatives will submit the enrolment forms on their behalf.

The 'JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2023 – 24 - Enrolment Form' must be clearly marked on the envelope containing the completed form. The closing date for enrolment is **26 February 2024 (12:00 noon)** (date of postmark no later than the deadline). Participants who have successfully made an enrolment will receive a confirmation email bearing their Entry Number (**on or before March 2024**).

(IV) Entries

Submission of Entries

The entries to be submitted in each category are set out as below:

- Junior Primary School Category	Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) with the Brief Description Form (Annex A)
- Senior Primary School Category; Junior Secondary School Category; and Senior Secondary School Category	Project Report (Annex B), Video and the Entry

Junior Primary School Category – Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) with the Brief Description Form (Annex A) $\,$

Note: Participants can give free rein to their imagination by capturing on a drawing paper for what they envision based on the topic of Cyber Security or Information Literacy. This is an opportunity for them to share their ideas and expectations with the public.

Rules of Enrolment:

- 1. Current primary one to three daytime JPC School Club students in Hong Kong and the Greater Bay Area only;
- 2. This category is open to individual participants only, i.e. no team enrolments. The Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) (the Drawing), including both the conception and the drawing, must be completed by the participants on their own;
- 3. The Drawing must be done on a drawing paper of A3 size (42 cm x 29.7 cm (+/-2 cm)) in landscape orientation;
- 4. Participants are free to adopt any form (e.g. oil painting, Chinese painting and crayon drawing are all acceptable), style and materials for the Drawing, as long as the entries are two-dimensional drawings. Other types of art or handicraft, including three-

- dimensional entries, will be rejected;
- 5. After completing the Drawing, participants should also complete the Brief Description Form (Annex A) (100 300 words) introducing the underlying concept; and
- 6. The Brief Description Form can be either completed with a ballpoint pen or electronically in a Microsoft Word file (in .doc or .docx format) and printed out afterwards. (e-version of the Brief Description Form could be download here or by scanning the QR code here (e-version)

Adjudication criteria:

The following kinds of entries will not be considered:

• Works that are i) plagiarized; ii) inconsistent with the size specified; iii) found to contain copyrighted images; iv) submitted without the Entry Number displayed on the item (except group submission); and v) in the form of a three-dimensional object will be disallowed.

Submission Guidelines:

For Creative Design Drawings (A3 Size) in the Junior Primary School Category, participants must submit the Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) and the Brief Description Form together before the deadline for entry submission. Submission can only be either one of the following means (No online submission will be accepted):


- 1. By post or drop-off in person:
 - Posted (to G.P.O Box No. 28247, date of postmark no later than the deadline);
 - Dropped off in person during office hours in the collection box (at the reception on 1/F, Arsenal House, Police Headquarters, 1 Arsenal Street, Wan Chai, Hong Kong); or
 - Dropped off in person at police stations in various districts (addressed to Police Community Relations Office).
- 2. Group Enrolment and Submission (collected by and submitted via schools or organizations)
 - Participants can complete the enrolment form together with the completed Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) and the Brief Description Form (Entry Number and further online enrolment is not required), and pass the entries to the representatives of the schools or organizations. Then the representatives will submit the enrolment forms on their behalf.

Submission Notes:

- No further online enrolment is required for participants who submit their entries via schools or organizations;
- If the Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) is accompanied by packaging, it must be clearly marked he 'JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2023 24 Junior Primary School Category's Competition Entry'; and
- The Brief Description Form showing the Entry Number (except group submission's participants), the name of the entry, and the name of the participant must be affixed properly to the centre of the back of the Drawing.

Senior Primary School Category, Junior Secondary School Category and Senior Secondary School Category – Project Report (Annex B), the Entry and Video

Note: Participants are required to give full play to their STEAM-related knowledge and skills in conducting research on constructing a smart and safe city, e.g. deterring crime, enhancing cyber security or reducing fatal or serious traffic accidents or other topics, which will culminate in the development of new products or technologies with practical applications, or the creation of functional scale models of such products or technologies so that the public can live in one of the safest and most stable cities in the world. Reports and videos on the process of research, experiments and investigation will be made to share with the public the discoveries made by the participants along the way.

Rules of Enrolment:

- 1. Current primary four to secondary six daytime JPC School Club students in Hong Kong and the Greater Bay Area only;
- 2. These categories are open to individuals and teams (no more than five members each), where the entire process including research, creation and production of models must be completed by the participant (s) and teammates on their own;
- 3. The Project Report should be submitted with a video (the Video) to introduce the entry under the same Entry Number. The shortlisted participants might be invited for adjudication sessions and entry submission at the Police Officers' Club (address: 28 Hung Hing Road, Causeway Bay, Hong Kong) on 6 or 7 April 2024;
- 4. The entry should conform to the dimensions of 60 cm in length by 60 cm in width by 60 cm in height (+/- 2 cm). JPC staff should be informed if the entry exceeds the size specified;
- 5. The Video should be in mp4 or mov format, no larger than 100MB in file size and no longer than 3 minutes in length, with Chinese or English commentary, for introducing the entry;
- 6. In writing up the Report, participants must complete the following sections: Entry Description in Section A (between 100 and 300 words) and Subject of Study in Section B (not more than 3,000 Chinese characters / 3,500 English words) in the Project Report (Annex B); additional information is not necessary;
- 7. The Report, which should give a brief description of the underlying concept and a detailed explanation about the entry, can be either completed with a ballpoint pen or electronically in a Microsoft Word file (in .doc or .docx format) and printed out afterwards (e-version of the Project Report can be downloaded here or by scanning the QR code ();

8. The entry must not violate the law or undermine the public interest; and

Submission Method:

For entries from the Senior Primary School, Junior Secondary School and Senior Secondary School Categories, the participants, with Entry Number obtained after enrolment, <u>must submit the Project Report (Annex B) and the Video before the deadline for entry submission through the following means. The shortlisted participants might be invited for adjudication sessions and entry submission at the Police Officers' Club (address: 28 Hung Hing Road, Causeway Bay, Hong Kong) on 6 or 7 April 2024.</u>

(V) Points to Note

- 1. Participants will be contacted or notified by email (for providing information including invitations to competition events and entry's submission method). Therefore, a regularly used email should be provided and checked by the participants;
- 2. Participants who submit their entries to the JPC website will receive a confirmation email to acknowledge the receipt of the entry (in or before March 2024);
- 3. Participants who fail to submit their Project Reports and Videos by the deadline (Entry Submission from Senior Primary School category, Junior Secondary School Category and Senior Secondary School Category will be notified separately) will be automatically disqualified from the Competition and not be entitled to a certificate of participation;
- 4. Entries must be based on the research that began in or after <u>February 2022</u>, i.e. within two years before the closing of enrolment of the Competition;
- 5. Entries that had participated in the first and second 'STEM-Up HK Innovation and Technology Competition' held in 2021 and 2022 and won the Champion/First Runner-up/Second Runner-up prize will not be accepted for re-entry, except those which had been significantly modified or optimized;
- 6. Each entry must be submitted with a unique Entry Number specified in the confirmation email from JPC (except group enrolment and submission of entries, i.e. collected by and submitted via schools or organizations);
- 7. If there is inadequate space for writing in Annexes A and B, participants may continue to complete the reports in additional A4 paper;
- 8. JPC shall not be responsible for any postal damage to the entry;

- 9. Participants should consider in-person submission of entries which are structurally complex or fragile at the JPC Section;
- 10. JPC will try its best to handle all entries with care and shall not be responsible for any damage or loss during the processing;
- 11. Subsequent to a review of the reports and videos uploaded, shortlisted participants (Senior Primary School Category, Junior Secondary School Category and Senior Secondary School Category) might be invited to attend adjudication sessions with their entries for detailed presentation at the Police Officers' Club on 6 or 7 April 2024 (address: 28 Hung Hing Road, Causeway Bay, Hong Kong). Participants should submit their entries to JPC after competed the adjudication sessions;
- 12. Participants are advised to keep an electronic copy of the materials submitted, which will not be returned after the conclusion of the Competition;
- 13. Participants are required to provide complete and accurate personal details, including their JPC Membership Numbers, if any. JPC has the right to disqualify any participant for supplying false or erroneous information;
- 14. JPC owns the copyright of all entries, which may be used in part or in full on any occasion including but not limited to internal circulation, public display, publication and/or other purposes;
- 15. JPC has the right to reject or disqualify any entry that is irrelevant to the theme and objective of the Competition;
- 16. JPC reserves the right to amend the rules and other details of the Competition and will provide relevant updates of the Competition on the JPC website and other JPC social media platforms from time to time;
- 17. Should there be any disputes, JPC will have the final authority to interpret the rules and make the final decision on the result of the Competition;
- 18. JPC shall not be responsible for any disputes related to intellectual property rights arising from the entries submitted; and
- 19. All JPC members participating in the competition can get points of 'I' Innovation under the JPC Award Scheme 2024 as an encouragement. Participants in Junior Primary School Category will be awarded 50 points, while the Senior Primary School Category to Senior Secondary School Category will be awarded 150 points. Should there be any disputes, JPC will have the authority to make final decision.
