Self-Introduction and Group Discussion

During 'Self-Introduction', all candidates will give a self-introduction in a group setting to the interviewers, who will then ask some follow-up questions and questions on current affairs and / or police related subjects as an initial assessment of candidates' general knowledge.

Additional scores will be awarded to candidates with foreign language skills such as Hindi, Urdu, Nepali, Tagalog, French, German, Korean or Japanese and so on in the Group Interview but Putonghua and English will not be counted for this purpose. Their written and oral proficiency will be tested with the help of an interpreter. Candidates claiming the possession of knowledge of foreign languages are required to additionally complete Part I of the 'Practical Incident Handling Test' in that foreign language. Candidates will also be tested on their verbal proficiency in that foreign language during 'Self-introduction' through an interpreter.

After the 'Self-introduction', candidates will attend a 'Group Discussion' on local current affairs or Force related issues as directed by the interviewers. The 'Self-Introduction' and the 'Group Discussion' are for assessing candidates' communication ability, judgement, general knowledge and confidence in a group setting.
